Terry L. Seaton, Pharm.D., FCCP, BCPS

Dr. Seaton is Professor of Pharmacy Practice at St. Louis College of Pharmacy, where he is preceptor of an elective advanced pharmacy practice experience in clinical informatics research and teacher of a required course on evidence-based medicine. He provided clinical pharmacy services to the BJC ACO and collaborates on implementation science research with the Washington University Institute for Public Health's Center for Dissemination and Implementation Research. He earned a BS in Pharmacy degree at the University of Colorado and a Doctor of Pharmacy degree at the University of Washington in Seattle. Dr. Seaton subsequently completed a general residency in Hospital Pharmacy and a specialty residency in family medicine also at the University of Washington. For 14 years, Dr. Seaton provided direct patient care, taught, and conducted primary care-related research at a community-based family medicine residency training program. Dr. Seaton has been a Board-Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist since its inception in 1991 and a Fellow of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy (ACCP) since 2000. In 2001, he was a United States Public Health Service Primary Care Policy Fellow. He is the current Chair of the Pharmacoinformatics Working Group in the American Medical Informatics Association and a member of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (Section of Pharmacy Informatics and Technology).
